Quality Catholic Schools Survey

All Catholic schools in the Diocese of Parramatta will be participating in Quality Catholic Schooling (QCS) in 2015, which will provide data from students, staff and parents about our school's cultural behaviour, relationships and learning community and will assist us to focus our efforts for improvement by building on our successes to date.

As this is the fourth year of the survey, it will enable us to track our progress on those areas identified from past findings and included in our school planning. From 9-20 March all staff, all students from Years 5 and 6, and 60 randomly selected parents will be asked to complete an online survey. Staff and students will complete the survey online at school. Parents will be sent home a paper survey but will also be able to complete the survey online if preferred. The survey will take about 20-30 minutes to complete.

A survey consultant (Insight SRC) has been engaged to manage the data collection. The survey data will be kept strictly confidential and no individual will be identified to the school or the Catholic Education Office. Each school will receive an information report in May to inform their planning.



THIS SURVEY has been sent home with some students on Monday this week. If you are selected to complete the survey, I would encourage your participation, as this will help our school to identify our strengths and areas in which we can focus our improvement. I would personally like to thank you for taking the time to complete the survey.

The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 12 -14 May 2015 for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 across Australia. It has been an everyday part of the school calendar since 2008.

These national tests will provide

information on how Australian students are performing in the areas of numeracy, reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation).

NAPLAN 2015

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy. NAPLAN tests skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time through the school curriculum and will assist teachers in identifying student strengths and weaknesses. By analysing results along with information from teacher judgments and work samples, teachers can adjust teaching strategies to provide appropriate support.

The aggregation of student results from the NAPLAN provides schools with an overview of current achievements for groups of students and contributes to a more comprehensive understanding of their performance. The analysis of aggregated results assists school planning and can be used to monitor literacy and numeracy development over time.

New for NAPLAN in 2015.

From 2015 there will be two writing prompts: one prompt for Years 3 and 5; and a different prompt for Years 7 and 9. Previously, there was one prompt for all year levels.

The change has been made following consultation with content and assessment experts as well as with states and territory representatives and other educators and researchers. It was concluded that the NAPLAN writing assessment would be better served by two writing prompts, one for Years 3 and 5 and a different one for Years 7 and 9.

The move to two prompts should have no impact on how teachers prepare their students for the NAPLAN writing test, with students still required to write the same sorts of responses. Both writing prompts will be on the same type of text – either narrative or persuasive – students will not have a choice of genre. The genre will be revealed on the day of assessment.


