Grandparents have the experience and knowledge that come from surviving a great many years of life's battles and hopefully, they have the wisdom to know when to share this experience and knowledge with their grandchildren. I would like to thank all parents and carers who took the time to complete this survey, we had 50 surveys completed.
The following results are:

- $\quad$ in favour of a healthy school canteen to provide lunches and would be used from twice to five times a week by most respondents
- in favour for Newsletters, Curriculum Overviews, Information Based Notes to be emailed online starting from next year. Please be aware that we would accommodate families who do not have any internet access, so no one misses out on information about the school. Almost all respondents were in favour for this to occur and would support this change.

Most respondents would like further information sessions about: (these are in order of popularity)

- Building resilience
- Cyberbullying
- Bullying

Other areas named:

- how grouping works in open classrooms,
- more information and guidance on how to improve the child's learning and what can parents do to help
- group based learning, skills and level of each student
- another respondent would like these information sessions at night etc


## Suggested areas for further improvements:

- gardening projects, environmental education
- more information in newsletters about property, taking care of identifying it if it is not theirs
- more consultation with parents regarding big decisions
- more opportunities for parental involvement
- more communication on what they are doing in class prefer grades separated - similar to the Kindergarten Weekly Newsletter

- students participating more in events i.e. assembly, liturgies, more activities, captivate, soccer and netball teams etc

## Did you know?

Have you ever wondered about Questions? When teaching, questions are a powerful tool to help children think and respond. Questioning is used throughout the day to help our students think and to provide a pathway for them to find the answer themselves rather than be 'told' the answer. Questions can be thick and thin, convergent and divergent, low and high.

Questions are the most powerful trigger for reflection:
Thinking questions get thinking answers...
Detail questions get detail answers...
Justifying questions get defensive answers...
Often we can ask closed ended questions, such as; Did you enjoy school today? This requires only a yes or no or a one word response. If we change this question to what is something that you learnt today, what was one thing that was funny today, tell me about the book you read today?
It requires a statement, phrase or perhaps even a story.
