#### NAPLAN 2015

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It has been an annual event for schools since 2008. On Tuesday 12th, Wednesday 13th and Thursday 14th May, students will take the 2015 NAPLAN tests.



NAPLAN assesses skills in literacy and numeracy that are developed over time, through the school curriculum. NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, but rather shows how students are progressing in numeracy and literacy skills against national standards for all Australia children. It also provides valuable information that allows schools and governments to better target effort and support to help all students achieve their potential and acquire the basic skills to help them build successful and happy lives.

NAPLAN tests fundamental skills rather than specific content, and as such is not a test for which students can study or drill. The best way you can help your child prepare for NAPLAN is to let them know that NAPLAN is just one part of their school program, and to urge them to simply do the best they can on the day. The use of services by coaching providers is not recommended.

The school will issue an individual student NAPLAN report later this year. Parents can use this information to monitor how their child is progressing and to identify any areas of concern. Parents may also wish to use their child's results to discuss progress with teachers.

- Year 3 Wednesday 13 May Reading (45 mins)
- Year 3 Thursday 14 May Numeracy (45 mins)
- Year 5 Tuesday 12 May Language Conventions (40 mins) Break Writing (40 mins)
- Year 5 Wednesday 13 May Reading (50 mins)
- Year 5 Thursday 14 May Numeracy (50 mins)

#### How can you as parents support your child?

- · Ensure your child has a good night's sleep.
- $\cdot$  Give them a solid healthy breakfast but don't over load them.
- · Provide healthy snacks and lunch on test days and plenty of water.
- · Cut back on after school activities if your child is tired, but encourage fresh air and a fun play out side.

## Hyde Park Barracks

On Monday 27 April, Stage 2 went on an excursion to Hyde Park Barracks. We caught the train to St James station and had lunch in Hyde Park. We had an amazing view of the city and we went for a walk to see St Marys Cathedral, the war memorial and the lovely trees in the park.

We arrived at the barracks that were built in 1817. The barracks held over 50 000 convicts in the first 20 years after it was constructed. We split into three groups and had a guided tour. We learned how the convicts built the barracks using a special technique to lay the bricks, were able to touch real leg irons made 200 years ago, dressed as convicts and laid in hammocks just as the convicts did. We had lots of fun and now have lots of knowledge to start of HSIE and Science units this term.
