We know that our new group of Kindergarten students will have many happy memories and meet many new friends. Often for parents, the families they meet when their child starts school will remain friends for life. We are very pleased and privileged to share this journey with the children and their families.

Transition happens for all of our students each year, this has been previously known as Promotions Day. Years I-5 move and meet their teachers before starting their new year in the learning space where they will be working in the following year. Depending on the needs of some students more strategic smaller transitions happen in the school week before the end of Term, these are subtly respectful to the student and their needs.

At the beginning of the school year, our Year 6 students have visitors from feeder high schools from their school leaders. Then the students attend a high school interview and in Term 4 they often have an orientation day.



Change is easy or more difficult for some, I know that most children remember their experience at transition and recall funny little anecdotes that have stayed in their minds throughout their years at school. Most commonly these memories are about feelings and the way people interacted with them rather than what they actually did. Therefore no matter our perspectives on how we feel about change it is important to normalise any feelings as well seeing the positive side to the change.

Our school community's reputation is a reflection of our parents and carers perspectives. This is often communicated to me in the interviews, I often hear, a neighbour or friend has recommended the school or often we have parents who attended this school themselves and have very fond memories and want these for their children.

Our St Nicholas of Myra community's (both school and parish) reputation is all of us together, when we are in our uniforms in the shops, playing sport on the weekends etc. I would like to thank you for supporting our school by speaking of it in a positive manner and living the gospel messages of Jesus.


Thank you for the visible and invisible work you do! Teaching is a true calling - a gift of self and service to our Catholic and Penrith community.
