#### Transition Morning (Promotions Day)

On Monday 14 December, the students will experience a transition to meet their new teachers and be in their learning space. During this time, the students will also be receiving their Resource Requirements.

As we move towards the end of the year, it is really important that we keep on being successful learners. The holidays are an opportunity to rest and to have family time at a more leisurely pace. Every minute counts in the final weeks and we need your help to keep our children at school everyday until the end of term.

Talk to your children about the importance of why you value learning, share with them what makes an effective learner. Here are some pointers:

- be actively engaged in the lessons
- use trial and error to make mistakes to work through the learning
- learning is hard at times and that is okay
- ask questions to your peers and your teachers
- learn from others and with others
- ask for feedback from your teachers on how you can improve
- use your initiative, persist and be willing

As we all know this time of year is when children become more tired and irritated and very ready for both holidays and the next step in the learning journey. It is a time when they find it easy to remember and talk about the negative times at school and to forget the things they are learning or the fun experiences they are having. During this time of change it is important to normalise the feelings that can be experienced by students who may feel anxious about change. The benefit of a smaller school is that many students know and learn with many different teachers which make this a great life skill practised and learned early. As we know when the students transition to high school they see many different teachers throughout a day.

To help out with a positive end to 2015 we would encourage you to try and use the following at home:

- Encourage good eating and sleeping routines
- Ask for one thing they learned today
- Ask for one thing they enjoyed on the playground

#### **HAVE YOU BOOKED?** (another part to our Transition)

Today, you would have received an online booking note for the beginning of next year. This is an annual beginning conversation where the teachers meet the students in a one to one setting and do some fun literacy and numeracy activities. These activities are used to inform and help teachers start the learning immediately at the student's point of need.
































#### 2016 is coming soon .....

#### Are you leaving the St Nicholas of Myra Community at the end of this Term?

#### PLEASE -

Ensure all Library Books are returned to the Library.

Return all Reading Books to the class teacher.

Ensure that all school fees have been paid in full – see the ladies in the office.

Collect all of your child's exercise books - these can be used at your child's new school.

If you will not need your child's uniform or library bag, you can donate them to the Uniform Shop.

Notify us in writing of the name of the school your child will be attending, new contact details and the date of last day at St Nicholas of Myra (a government requirement)

<u>Please note: This does not include students in Year 6 moving onto high school as we already have this infor-</u> <u>mation.</u>

#### **CHANGE TO BUS PASSES**

From Term 1, 2016 paper bus passes will be replaced by the new School Opal card. As with the current School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) students will be eligible for free travel as follows: Years K-2 (Infants) – no minimum distance from their school; Years 3-6 (Primary) – 1.6km straight line distance or 2.3km walking distance or further from school. Applications can be made via a new online application process.



Many students with a current SSTS pass won't need to reapply, as a new pass will be issued automatically. This will be either a School Opal card or a school travel pass if the student needs to travel outside the Opal network to get to school.

However, you will need to complete an application form if:

- Applying for SSTS for the first time
- Enrolling in kindergarten
- Progressing from year 6 to year 7
- Changing name, school and/or address
- Requesting a new additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation

If a student doesn't qualify for a free travel pass, they may be eligible for a Term Bus Pass which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term. Application for 2016 School Opal Cards and SSTS passes starts from Monday 2 November. To apply online, please go to:
