Online Homework- Frequently Asked Questions

What devices can I use Lexia and Matific on?

- Lexia and Matific can both be used on any computer or Chromebook by going to http://www.lexiacore5.com/.
- iPad and Android devices can also be used by downloading the <u>Lexia Core5 UK</u> and Matific app.

What email address do I put in when I log into Lexia?

You will need to put your teacher's email address in so your device recognises you are from St Nicholas. Please do not use these to contact the teachers.

How long should my child spend on Lexia each week?

Primary- 40 minutes

Infants- 20-30 minutes

Students can spend more time on Lexia if they wish. They do not need to complete a level each week. There is a lot of content in each level (especially upper primary) and it may take them a couple of weeks to complete a level. The program will save where the child is up to and continue from where they are up to next time they log in.

How long should my child spend on Matific each week?

Your child's class teacher will set a number of tasks to complete each week.

What if my child does not have access to the internet or a device at home?

There is a PAKZ Homework Group that runs twice a week where students can access a device to complete their homework. These are held one morning from 8:30 (day varies and you will be notified on Seesaw) and Friday Lunch.


