Reading practice at home is a great time where parents can help their children learn that reading is fun.

Tips to help Parents:

Be honest and supportive. Give specific, honest feedback to your child's attempts to answer questions or solve problems.

*If an answer or reasoning is correct, praise your child in a way that is appropriate to his/ her age and experience.

****If the answer is wrong,** do not be afraid to acknowledge that it is wrong, but be quick to point out the praiseworthy aspects of the answer. ("You tried hard; "You thought of a word that made sense.")

More Ways to Give Specific Praise:

Consider using some of the following terms as a way to show your praise and approval:

- Wow! Good for you...Keep it up. Way to go. Super! Look at your great progress....
- I like the way you are working. Good readers fix their mistakes.
- You figured it out! You should be proud... You make it look easy. Keep up the good work. Great answer.
- What great reading. That's it! Good thinking. You're doing better. Keep going. Fine reading...

By using praise Parents can help their children to see that it is good to be a learner and that reading is fun!!
