Dear St Nicholas of Myra Families,

Last Tuesday (15 August) is one of the Holy Days of Obligation in our Church. It is the Feast of the Assumption, Mary's special feast day. Catholics are required to attend Mass on this day.

If we were asked to offer a phrase or two to describe the word "mother," most of us would come up with something like this: an amazing, multi-talented person, who gives birth, demonstrates loyalty, bears sorrow, offers support and encouragement, looks after her family. Well, from the most ancient of times, Mary has been venerated under the title of God-bearer or Mother of God. Down through the ages, paintings and statues of Mary have mostly given expression to a "motherly smile," a smile that is welcoming and expresses peace and serenity.

The Christians of the early Church would have been well aware of the role Mary fulfilled as a constant connection with Christ. It was she who had nurtured Him during the years leading up to His public life. She had a leading role at the marriage celebration in Cana, when Jesus began His public life. At the end of His life, Mary witnessed the sorrowful events of the Passion, Crucifixion and Death of her Son. Mary was with the Apostles when they gave witness to the facts of the Resurrection and Ascension. It was Mary, the constant Mother, who prayed with the Apostles and sustained them in their belief until the First Pentecost.

There is little written about Mary, especially what happened after Pentecost, but there is strong evidence, through tradition, that at the end of her life she was united with her Son in a manner similar to how her Son was united with His Father. After an in-depth study of tradition and the early writings of the Church, and after broad consultation with bishops, theologians and lay people, Pope Pius XII in 1950 declared that, ".... The Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory."

Mary is a strong example of her life in service of God. Mary's speech is recorded only four times in the Gospels, her physical presence is noted 24 times, as the way by which she exercises her ever "Yes" to God. Despite this her presence and importance in our Catholic faith was sacramental, by being united with her Son and Father completes the fidelity to truth and love, as a supreme witness to Abba. Mary lived a pure human existence to its fullness. This is the Christ-meaning expressed by the Christian sacraments as they trans-signify human life. Mary lived these sacraments by being pure in giving life to Jesus and His death and resurrection—the primordial sacrament of God's saving presence.

Mary had been so closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus' life, so it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to believe and declare, that she must be with Him body and soul in heaven. Mary is now in a position to be mother to all people for all time.

"Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us, your people, now, and at the hour of our death. Amen."

It has come to our attention that the procedures around dropping of and collecting of children from the 'Kiss and Drive' zone are not being adhered to.

Firstly, please DO NOT overtake another car in the turning circle or mount the island. Not only is it dangerous but also illegal. ROAD SAFETY

Please try and leave home 5 minutes earlier to avoid rushing and causing stress to yourself and your children. Please have your child's bag and hats inside the car not in the boot.

Essentially, the 'Kiss and Drive' zone allows for only a two minute period where a vehicle can be stationary and children may be dropped off or picked up. The driver MUST NOT leave the vehicle. Some people have been parking in the zone for much greater length of time and getting out of their vehicles to walk children to the entrance gates in the morning. This is inconvenient for other drivers.

Finally, please DO NOT start queuing up to collect your child before 3:15pm

We are very fortunate to have a well developed 'Kiss and Drive' zone that operates smoothly when all concerned follow correct procedure.

We will listen to others.




