Dear St Nicholas of Myra Families,

Last week we began the season of Lent. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Lent is a season of reflection and preparation before the celebrations of Easter. By observing the 40 days of Lent, we replicate Jesus Christ's sacrifice and withdrawal into the desert for 40 days. During Lent, we take up practices that help us to become aware of and responsive to the needs of others. The three traditional practices of Lent are; prayer, fasting and almsgiving. A commitment to these practices during Lent leads to an awareness of God and conversion of the heart.

To me, God and compassion are one and the same. Compassion is the joy of sharing. It's doing small things for the love of each other-just a smile, or carrying a bucket of water, or showing some simple kindness. These are small things that make up compassion. Compassion means trying to share and understand the suffering of people (Mother Teresa, Blessed Teresa of Calcutta).

As a school community our theme for the year is Kindness just as Mother Teresa emulated in her life. Each week, at school, we have a focus on how we can be kind to one another. Jesus was a model of kindness and we ask our students to walk in His footsteps. Lent is an important time for us to consider the ways we are showing acts of kindness to each other. A few simple acts of kindness you could adopt this Lenten season include:

- holding the door open for someone
- doing a chore/job without someone asking
- leaving a letter for someone
- smiling at people
- leaving a thank you note or saying 'thank you'
- volunteering
- donating to project compassion.

Think about some ways you can show kindness to each other this Lent; in your families, in your workplace and in our school community. Hopefully, this Lent we will be able to lead our children to a better understanding of compassion and how they can exercise this virtue in their lives. Sometimes reading the prayers of another person can lead us to personal prayer so maybe the following could have the same effect:

"Lord, even when the world around us is swirling and broken, thank you for being true, kind and a foundation to lean on. Today, we boldly and humbly approach you asking for your kindness to meet us. Amen".

Thank you to all of the parents, grandparents and carers who joined us for our open learning spaces during Catholic Schools Week.


Twilight Tours

Student Learning Goals

Now is a great time to check in and ask how your children feel they are progressing with their learning goal/s. Here are some questions;

How are you going with your goal?

How do you know you are almost there or achieved it? Why are you proud of the progress you are making? What could help you to progress further with your learning goal?

This great info-graph found on Twitter; raises the key message that getting something wrong or failing is what helps us to learn, ignites our curiosity and assists us to build resilience.

Failing is not a 'bad' thing if we learn from the "MIS takes" to have deeper learning. When we are learning to ride a bike without training wheels, we wobble, we fall off, we hold onto the balance for a micro second, and put our feet on the ground from side to side. All of these moments are 'failing', we don't celebrate those moments, we clap the persistence when the child keeps on getting on the bike for that final - YAY I am riding my bike moment!



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NAPLAN

NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. At the classroom level, it is one of a number of important tools used by teachers to measure student progress.

This year we will be participating in NAPLAN Online tests. The testing period is from Tuesday 14 May until Friday 24 May. Please see the table below which explains when these tests will occur. NAPLAN Online tests will need to be taken in a specific order. Individual students are not permitted to sit the online tests after Friday 24 May 2019.

Each year and each term we practise our Evacuation Procedures. This term we rehearsed our lockdown off the playground procedures, where the students are explicitly taught what to do and they were able to complete this with great success. Later this term, we will hold a lockdown off the playground without them being aware so we can see how they can apply this in action when it is not expected.

At times during the year, St Nicholas of Myra students have the opportunity to be photographed and videoed. Concerns regarding the most recent Momo Challenge have been named by different parents. Thank you for bringing these to our attention.

Any time a viral challenge occurs we must engage in often difficult and open conversations. These conversations can often link well to our school expectations of safety and respect as well as our school values of responsibility, compassion and respect. The most important thing to do is to have the conversation with your child,

even if it is "I am not sure I will do some research and get back to you about this online viral challenge". By avoiding the conversations we can allow 'miss truths' to become reality.

Often we feel helpless as we don't know where or what these are and how it is being accessed. The Australian Government has an e-safety website; <u>https://www.esafety.gov.au</u> which we recommend parents to use which can assist you when these items arise.

There is currently a statement issued regarding the Momo challenge (just type it into the search bar and it will appear). We often use this site as a point of reference. The big key message to parents is if in doubt, say 'no' until you know more, disconnect the device, if the messaging is not positive or productive switch it off, participate in the games and monitor at home particularly online messaging through games. In some games, the messaging component can be turned off. If you feel you need to learn more about what to do please use the government link below to assist it has parental tips as well as places to go to report or find support.
