Dear St Nicholas of Myra Families,

Here's a piece of fiction that is probably reality in the lives of quite a few people. Rachel is a teacher, dedicated to her profession and to the children she teaches. Rachel is single, childless and approaching mid-life. As the years have gone by, she has become more frustrated at having no children of her own. She views her life as a transit lounge for a procession of children who come into her classroom, are taught by her but then move onto other classrooms to a life away from her; they simply pass through her life.

Rachel has a sister, Stacey, and one day confides her frustration to her. Stacey is not as sympathetic as Rachel might have wanted, as Stacey says that her life is not so different to her sister's. Her children, too, consume her life and, as they grow older, become more independent as they move through her life and move onto their own lives. Rachel and Stacey are characters in Margaret Laurence's novel, A Jest of God.

The reality for Rachel and Stacey is the reality for all of us who have children. They are never really ours like possessions; they are given to us for a short period of time during which we are asked to nurture and care for them. Henri Nouwen in his book, Reaching Out, puts it this way: "It belongs to the Christian message that children are not properties to own and rule over, but gifts to cherish and care for. Our children are most important guests, who enter into our home, ask for careful attention, stay for a while and then leave to follow their own way. Home is the place where they can be encouraged to listen to their inner selves and develop the freedom that gives them courage to eventually leave their home and travel on."

Our children are really not ours, we are only their guardians. Like for us, God is the real parent and God's love and care for them will always be greater than ours. Moreover, God has the power to touch the heart of our child and break through to our child in a way that we, as parents, often cannot. God can reach into places where we cannot reach. God is always there with a love more patient and strong than is our own. This can be of great consolation to us, if our children ever stop listening to us, turn their backs on us, reject our values and even turn away from everything we stand for. God, they cannot walk away from.

God's partnership with us comes to the surface every now and then and one such occasion is when our children receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. Prior to the first Confirmation, Jesus' disciples were in no-man's-land. Jesus had gone from them and there was a void in their lives. For ten days after the Ascension they gathered together waiting for something to happen, as Jesus said it would. They had ten days to go over the past three years when Jesus had been the centre of their lives; ten days to reassess their own lives and be supportive of one another.

Our children, through our example and the preparation they receive at school and parish, also have time to consider their lives, to become aware of the Seven special gifts of the Spirit and the practise of the fruits of the Spirit: "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." Galatians 5:22-23. When the disciples, on the first Pentecost day, received the Holy Spirit into their lives, they were changed forever and they in turn changed the lives of thousands of other people.

Likewise, our children, when they receive the Holy Spirit in Confirmation, will receive the potential for change. God is now with them, with the fullness of his presence, as they move ahead in their own individual lives. God will always be there, when perhaps we are not, with a love patient and everlasting.

Congratulations to the students and their families for making their Confirmation!

General News

Summer Uniform

Full summer school and sports uniform is compulsory from now until the end of the year. Thank you for your continued support with our students showing respect and pride in their school.

SWEAT and WET weather

As in winter when it is rainy (wet weather) we keep the students inside; as is the same in summer when the weather is too hot. Each day is determined at the point in time as we also need to care for not only our students but also our teachers wellbeing and safety as they are outside on duty. Thank you to the parents who pack a water bottle and extra drinks on warmer days. This is where the students wearing the hats is paramount as well as the application of sunscreen prior to arriving at school.

Refunds and Notice Period

A term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during term for the next term. Where appropriate notice has been received a pro-rata credit can be calculated. Leaving Year K to 11 Students pay fees based on a pro-rata 40 week year and Year 12 Students pay fees based on a pro-rata 30 week year. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment, that is, the notice period of 10 school weeks will be waived in this circumstance.

The requirement for a terms notice (10 school weeks) is recognition by the family of the commitment to assist with funding of the School by having their child take a place that could have been offered to another family. Unless the student is present for the August census or the student is able to be replaced mid-year, which is unlikely, the loss of the student will most certainly result in the loss of significant government funding. Thus, a term notice provides the school with an opportunity to replace the student within the next term. Special circumstances that would warrant a waiving of this notice, include:

- Moving due to employment transfer
- Sale of house
- The student has been offered full time employment
- The student has been offered an apprenticeship

*Naturally this policy cannot cover every circumstance and parents are invited to discuss such matters with the Principal for individual rulings.

Final receipting for 2019

The final day for receiving any monies for 2019 is Friday 13 December 2019. No monies can be received over the counter in the office from this date. Therefore there will be no canteen in the last week of school and no purchases of bags, library bags or tab ties.

Enrolments for 2020

We understand that family circumstances alter and that children sometimes need to change schools. If you know that you will not be attending St Nicholas of Myra in 2020 please advise the school and complete a notification of leaving form that is available from the school office. You are reminded that concerns regarding financial difficulties is not a reason for seeking another school, as the Catholic Education Office and St Nicholas of Myra can and will assist families with meeting these costs when genuine financial difficulties arise.

We have healthy enrolments for most classes in 2020, with some children on waiting lists, so in fairness to these families we ask you to let us know if you are changing schools. If you know of anyone considering a Catholic school education for their child at St Nicholas of Myra from 2019, in any grade, please encourage them to contact the school as soon as possible to assist us with our planning.

Kiss & Go

We are very fortunate to have a Kiss & Go drop off point at our school. To ensure the safety for all our school community and neighbours we all need to follow the rules:

- Children to get out of the car KERB side only. Parents are not to leave their vehicle.
- Please do not park or block our neighbouring driveways.
- Please do not start queuing up before 3:05pm to collect your children. It creates double parking which is a fineable offence. Police and Rangers patrol the area and fines may be issued.

Extra Curricular

Swim School

The school swimming program, held at Nepean Aquatic Centre, is taking place in Week 8 of Term 4 (Monday 02/12/19 to Friday 06/12/19). This is a change in structure to previous years where the students attended a two week program with shorter lessons. The program is run by fully trained instructors who are employed by Nepean Swim and Fitness.

During the program, students will be assessed in regards to their ability and placed into specific groups catering for their needs, with all lessons running for 60 minutes. Teachers will be attending and also offer supervision at the pool as well as organising students at school and on the return journey. Students will be travelling to and from the pool by bus and this is included in the cost of the program. Please find below an outline of departure and arrival times as well as what your child/children will be required to wear and bring to school each day.

- Students are to wear their swimmers to school, with their school uniform over the top.
- Students need to bring to school, in a separate bag; underwear to change into, a t-shirt to wear to the pool over swimmers, towel, goggles (if desired) and thongs (or the like) as footwear must be worn to the pool.
- Students will change out of their wet swimmers and back into their underwear and school uniform upon returning to school.
- A plastic bag is needed to place in wet items.
- LABEL all items worn to school and brought in the bag including shoes, socks, underwear, towel
 and goggles
- Sun block is NOT required as the centre is an indoor facility.
- All students are required to dress and undress themselves so please practise and encourage independence at home.

Nepean Aquatic Centre would like Parents and Carers to accurately complete the Enrolment/Assessment form as this will assist with the organisation of groups.


Stage 2 Excursion


To be eligible for selection for these trials an Online Team Registration Form must be completed that can be accessed below.

One form is to be completed per child, per individual sport. Each sport has its own criteria, therefore, it is imperative that the correct form is completed.


Please note that your online registration is an EXPRESSION OF INTEREST ONLY and MUST be approved by the child's school. In order for the child to attend the nominated trial or event, this may come down to the discretion of the school as to who is selected to attend the trial. In some sports, only 2 students per school can be nominated. All fields and especially "Representative Experience" MUST be completed.

Under no circumstances will a child be eligible to trial if the Online Registration Form has not been completed and approved by the school by the closing date.






